Sky & Telescope will send out a list annually to verify club membership. You may also phone in your renewal at 1-800-253-0245. You will need to know your subscription number when you call. The new change should make renewing your subscription more convenient and allow you to use your credit card. The down side seems to be that it has added about an extra month to getting renewals and new subscriptions started. So send renewals in at least 2 months before they expire.

"Astro-Surfing" – Astronomy on the Internet by D. J. Karcher

#1 - Your Basic Daily Astronomy Fix!

The internet has become a basic part of everyday communications in modern day life and the



amount of information that it contains and transmits is absolutely incredible. I log on daily to check e-mail and do a bit of "surfing on the net". Over the last few years, I've discovered a few sites that have become almost a ritual to check every day, and have been added to my "favorites" list on my web browser. In just a few minutes, I can get a daily astronomy fix, learn a few new facts and perhaps get a bit of late breaking news from the world of the stars. This list is by no means comprehensive, but it has become my habit to check these sites when I first log on and check my e-mail. I hope that you'll enjoy them too, if you've not already found these fine resources.

APOD – Astronomy Picture of the Day (<u>http://antwrp.gsfc.nasa.gov/apod/astropix.html</u>) the granddaddy of daily internet picture sites. APOD has been around since 1995 and never fails to provide a "wow" factor photograph along with interpretation by a professional astronomer. The pictures (naturally) are heavily based on NASA resources, but there are numerous contributions by amateur astronomers.

EPOD – Earth-Science Picture of the Day (<u>http://epod.usra.edu/index.php3</u>) another NASA grant site that highlights the diverse processes and phenomena which shape the planet Earth. EPOD collects and archives photos, imagery, graphics, and artwork with short explanatory captions and links exemplifying features within the Earth system and frequently highlights atmospheric and meteorological phenomena that are of significant interest to the astronomy community.

LPOD – Lunar Photo of the Day (<u>http://www.lpod.org/</u>) this site is run by Charles A. Wood, a lunar geological expert and regular contributor to Sky & Telescope Magazine. LPOD always has a fine example of amateur lunar photography or historical information with Chuck's professional interpretation of the images.

NASA - Image of the Day Gallery (<u>http://www.nasa.gov/multimedia/imagegallery/index.html</u>) a fine smorgasbord of NASA images and archives, updated Monday through Friday. The site includes links to Hubble, Cassini and many other important and current NASA projects. Good way to stay up-to-date on the ISS and Space Shuttle programs.

Universe Today (<u>http://www.universetoday.com/</u>) - a good site for breaking news and what's up in the sky, but has a heavy dose of advertising. Lots of great links, however.

Space Weather (<u>http://spaceweather.com/</u>) – news and information about the Sun-Earth environment. Sunspot & aurora alerts as well as general news and information on breaking events (had a lot of great information about the comet 17P/Holmes outburst). Not a lot going on with the Sun currently near solar sunspot minimum, but an excellent place to check for news routinely.


